WELCOME TO ST. MORITZ

The St. Moritz Match Race is one of ten events of the World Match Racing Tour; it belongs as such to the official ISAF Match Racing World Championship.

We organized the first match race event here in the Engadin in 2001, with the co-operation of the St. Moritz Sailing Club. The St. Moritz Match Race was officially launched in 2003, after Alinghi's victory in New Zealand, at Roni Pieper's initiative.

Twelve teams that include the leaders of the world's match race ranking and the America's Cup will compete

alongside young talents. It is the eighth time that this quest for the legendary title of «King of the Mountain» will take place. A prize money of 150'000 CHF will be distributed to the best teams.

The duals will take place from the 31st of August to the 5th of September 2010 in the unique «sailing arena» of Lake St. Moritz. The races will be commented live and can easily be watched from the shores of the lake.

THE WORLD MATCH RACING TOUR

The World Match Racing Tour is the world's leading professional sailing series. The ten events Tour is the only global series that touches four continents. It features America's Cup teams, skippers and the world's top match racers. Sanctioned by the International Sailing Federation (ISAF), it is one of three properties with "Special Event" status alongside the America's Cup and the Volvo Ocean Race.

The WMRT uses the same one-on-one match race format (course, rules, umpires) as the America's Cup. The races always take place in one-design yachts supplied by the event organisers, for a true test of skill and teamwork. The boats usually range from 30-40 feet, with 4-6 crewmembers. The St. Moritz Match Race takes place on blu26, a fast and dynamic race yacht designed by Swiss sailor Christian Scherrer.

Each WMRT event lasts 5 days. The races usually take place as close as possible to the shore for a unique spectator and hospitality experience. The WMRT television coverage reaches over 600 million households in 75 countries through 34 broadcasters.

MATCH RACING: A DUEL ON THE WATER


Match Racing is considered by many as the most fascinating way of sailing, both for the actors and for the spectators. Unlike fleet racing, where each competitor sails against the entire fleet, Match Racing consists in duels. During the Round Robins, each skipper has to compete at least once against all other competitors. Once the Round Robins are over, the top ranked sailors compete in the quarter, semi-finals and finals which take place on a "dead or alive" basis. Match Racing is an extremely technical discipline. The pre-starts, the knowledge of the racing rules and the boat handling are the elements that will make the difference between the teams.

Race course: The races always start between the Starting vessel and a buoy established at the pin end of the line. The departure line is perpendicular to the wind. After the start, the boats beat towards the windward mark (1),

and then sail back to the leeward mark under spinnaker. They leave the leeward mark to starboard before doing a second lap and finally crossing the arrival line. The matches last approximately fifteen minutes with an average wind. The starting line is also the arrival line.

The pre-start and the start: the race begins with a sound signal given 7 minutes before the start, followed by other sound signals 5, 4 and 1 minute before the departure. The pre-start begins 4 minutes before the departure; it is an essential moment of the race. The two sailboats enter on stage,

each one on a determined side of the line, and they immediately head for each other. The first crossing is often the most important one; it gives the opportunity to the competitors to take the advantage over their opponent. The departure strategies, the capacity to accelerate and to manoeuvre, as well as the time management are essential elements of a pre-start. Unlike fleet races, where it is essential to cross the line at the second of the start, what counts in a Match Race is to be ahead of the other boat, even if it means crossing the line late. It's all down to controlling the opponent.



BLUBOATS

Bluboats was founded in spring 2006 by professional sailor Christian “Blumi” Scherrer and Yacht designer Christian Bolinger. Bluboats is a consultant and distribution company specialized in developing fast and elegant sailing yachts for inshore races; it benefits from a large network of specialist and partners. The objective of the company is to develop semi-custom and one-design sailing yachts, all optimized for inland water sailing. The blu30 semi-custom was the company’s first boat, soon followed by the blu26, which was launched as a one-design at the end of 2006.

The blu26 is the boat used during the St. Moritz Match Race. Christian Scherrer, its designer, is an America’s Cup sailor and Match Race World Champion; he believes that the pleasure to sail is a priority and designed the blu26 with this goal in mind.

In collaboration with Naval Design, rigorous prototype testing resulted in fine-tuning of the deck layout and sail plan. Her low hull weight, which is achieved by the use of sandwich construction, and the simplicity of her rudder and lifting keel system are impressive. Combined with her moderate beam, these features enable easier road transport. The big spinnaker allows optimal trimming and speed on downwind courses. The blu26 is best sailed with a crew of 4, allowing her huge potential for speed and manoeuvrability to be fully developed.



ABOUT the skipper	<p>Mathieu Richard has been present on the Tour for the past seven years, finishing 2nd and 3rd overall in 2007 and 2008 respectively. He has sailed with the same team since 2000, and relishes the challenge match racing sailing provides. He has already participated four times in St. Moritz Match race. Richard is an extremely consistent racer, achieving six top five finishes last year. He is in fifth position overall on the 2010 Tour and won Stage one of the Match Race France, also claiming 3rd place at Match Race Germany. Richard won the Korea Match Cup and finished 7th at Portimão Portugal Match Cup, which gives him enough points to stay at the top of the 2010 ISAF WMRT Standings.</p>	<p>Torvar Mirsky tried match racing after enjoying a successful youth dinghy background and has never looked back. He finished runner up in the 2009 Tour and, together with Minoprio, is regarded as one of the rising stars of the sport. Mirsky's rapid ascent up the World Rankings in the last two years has led his team to the position of World No.2. He is supported by Sailing Racing International as well as Kaenon Polarized. He is one of the favourites of St. Moritz Match Race for his third participation in the event.</p>	<p>Winners of the 2009 World Tour (and St. Moritz stopover), Adam Minoprio won three events on last year's Tour, including the season ending Monsoon Cup. His consistency extended to two runner-up positions and confirmed his dominance over the 2009 season. Minoprio is the youngest winner of the World Tour and together with Torvar Mirsky leads a new breed of young matcher's eager to displace the established pros. He is currently ranked No.1 on the World Rankings. Minoprio and his team have had a good start in the 2010 series with a win at Match Race Germany.</p>

ABOUT the skipper	<p>Ian Williams became Great Britain's first Tour champion in 2007 and repeated the feat in 2008. A qualified lawyer, Williams took a sabbatical from the profession in 2005 to really give his sailing a go. Five years later, two match racing world championships are a testament of a decision well made!</p> <p>Ian has been ranked inside the World's top 10 for much of the last decade and is one of the strongest competitors on the circuit. 2009 was a disappointing year for him despite a good third place in St. Moritz; however, with a new team this year, he has started the 2010 campaign well and is one of the Tour's strongest sailors.</p>	<p>Ben Ainslie began sailing at the age of 8 with his parents, whom he credits as the most influential people in his life. "They have travelled with me all over the world and given me their support for many years." Ainslie has gone on to become one of the world's most famous sailors and a star Olympian. He has won medals at the previous four Olympics, including three gold's, and dominated the Finn class in recent years. Now Ainslie, together with Team Origin, has turned his attention to match racing and conquering the World Tour. Last year he won two Tour events and is one of the favourites for the 2010 series. He will compete in St. Moritz for the third time.</p>	<p>Francesco Bruni is a newcomer to the World Tour, having enjoyed a hugely successful career in dinghy and keelboat racing. A triple Olympian, Bruni is a man of many talents, having represented his country in the laser, 49er and star classes. Racing for the Joe Fly team, Bruni has reached the podium in the Farr 40, Melges 24 and Melges 32 World Championships. With his broad, successful background, Bruni was chosen to helm the Azzurra America's Cup Team, and skippered the team to immediate success at the first Louis Vuitton Trophy in Nice. He will compete in St. Moritz for the second time.</p>

ABOUT the skipper	<p>Björn Hansen is one of the many top Scandinavian helmsmen who have competed regularly on the World Tour, including two previous participations in St. Moritz Match Race. An amateur sailor, Hansen and his team are restricted by the amount of time they can dedicate to their passion due to other work commitments. However, such restraints have not prevented Hansen from becoming a regular fixture in the top 10 of the ISAF World Match Racing rankings and an event winner on the Tour. Victory came a few years ago at his home event of Match Cup Sweden, breaking the home nation's hoodoo at its own event.</p>	<p>Bertrand Pacé is a veteran of the world's match racing scene. Winner of the first Tour in 1994 (the Swedish Match Tour as it was called those days), he makes his come back this year. Pacé has also been active in offshore racing; he has competed in the Olympic Games and in the America's Cup and is one of France's most experienced yacht racers. He will compete for the first time in St. Moritz. His best result so far in 2010 is an 8th place at Korea Match Cup.</p>	<p>Johnnie «Captain Bluetooth» Berntsson loves to sail in a team and has done so from an early age. Berntsson Sailing Team was formed in 1997 and has been competing at ISAF World Match Racing Tour events since 2006. 2008 saw Berntsson win the Argo Group Gold Cup (previously King Edward VII Gold Cup); his team is currently 11th in the ISAF World Match Racing Rankings. Berntssons' full time job is a project leader of computer systems in the healthcare information technology sector, which keeps him busy in between racing events. Berntsson has received a wild card for St. Moritz Match Race, where he will compete for the second time.</p>

ABOUT the skipper	<p>Damien Iehl has been one of France's leading match race sailors for the past couple of years. Involved in the WMRT since 2008, he has obtained his best results on Lake Konstanz, where he won Match race Germany in 2008. His victory in the Spanish Open has given him a direct access to St. Moritz Match Race 2010, where he will compete for the first time. His best result this year is an eighth place at Match Race Sweden.</p>	<p>Eric Monnin is Switzerland's best match race helmsman. Involved in the World Match Racing Tour since 2001, he is also known for inventing and developing the Alinghi Match Race simulator alongside his brother Jean-Claude. Monnin sails regularly with his two brothers Marc and Jean-Claude. He comes from Immensee, in Switzerland, and is currently ranked 26th in the world ranking. Monnin and his team have won the qualifier Zug Match Race in 2010. They will compete in St. Moritz for the eighth time.</p>	<p>Jérôme Clerc comes from Lausanne but he sails in Geneva. He is very experienced despite his young age. A regular competitor in the "Surprise" Class, he is a multiple Swiss champion of this one-design. Jérôme is also the skipper of the Geneva entry in the Tour de France à la Voile; a team supported by the city of Geneva and its training centre: the Centre d'Entraînement à la Régate. Clerc and his team just finished second of the Tour de France in the amateurs category. Second of the qualifier in Zug, they received a wild card for St. Moritz Match Race; a regatta that will be their first Grade 1 regatta.</p>


the centre of the town and motorboats are provided for the press.
